




UK food and non-alcoholic drink inflation (CPIH)


UK producer prices (PPI)


Crude oil (\$/bbl) and natural gas (\$/mmbtu)








Freightos Baltic Index (FBX): Global Container Freight Index



Straight fertilisers, 2015 = 100

















Feed wheat, 2015 = 100






