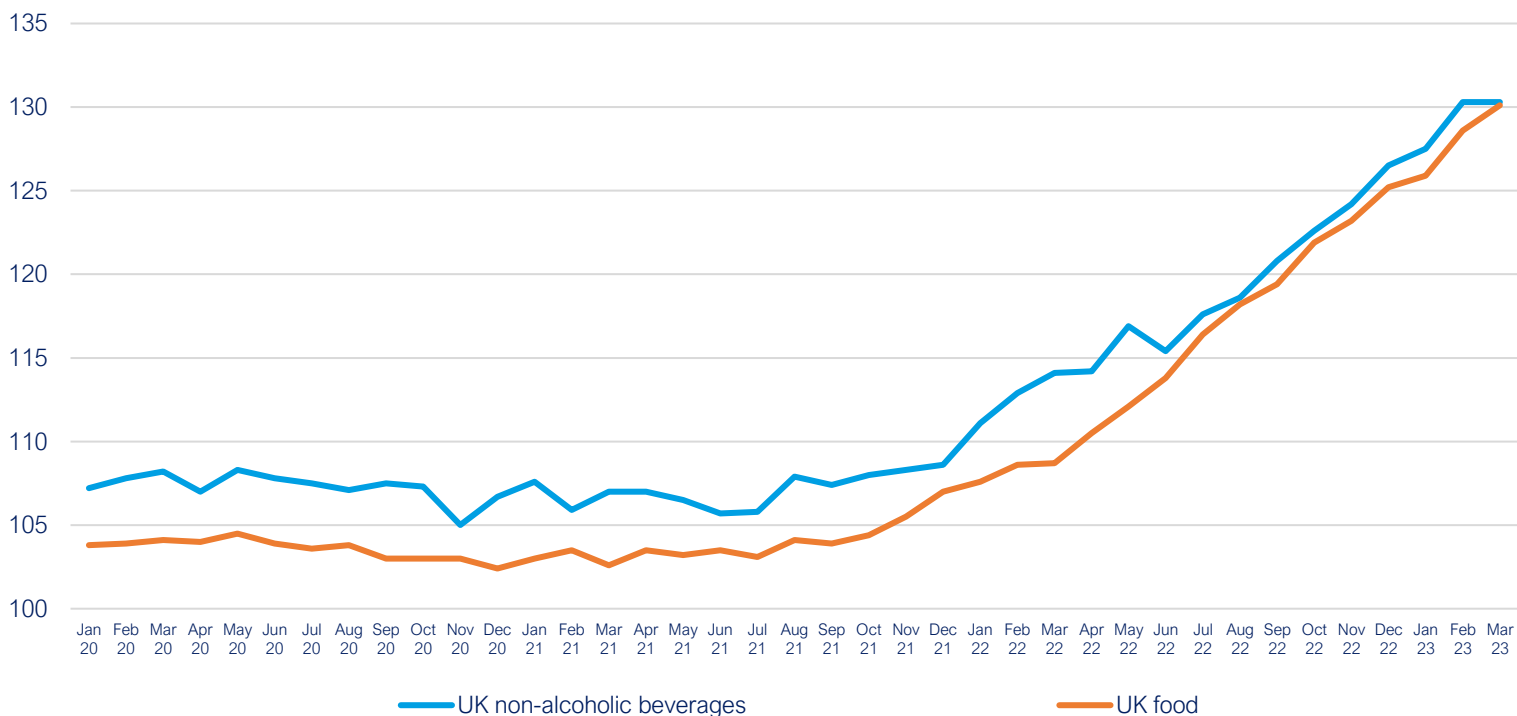

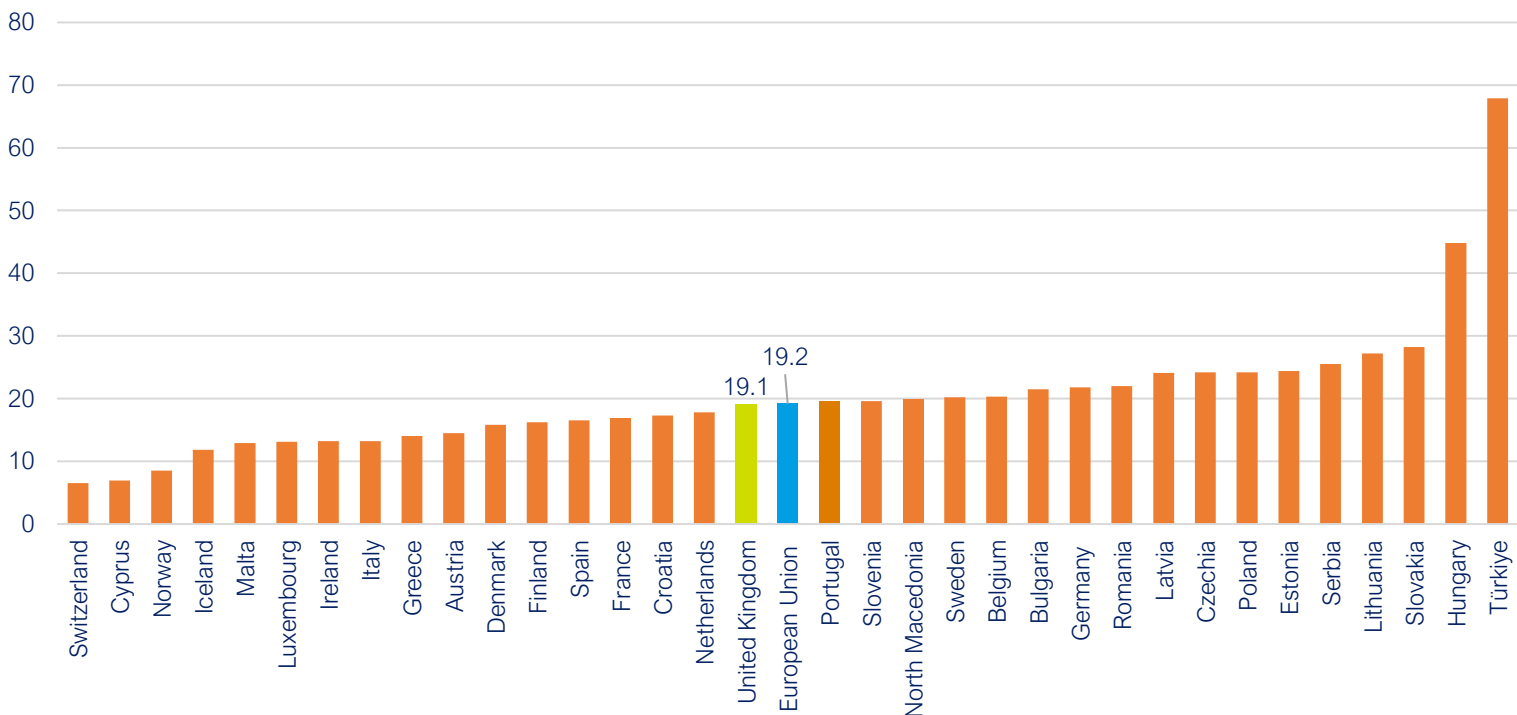
UK food and UK non-alcoholic beverages, 2015=100

Food and drink inflation comparison with Europe

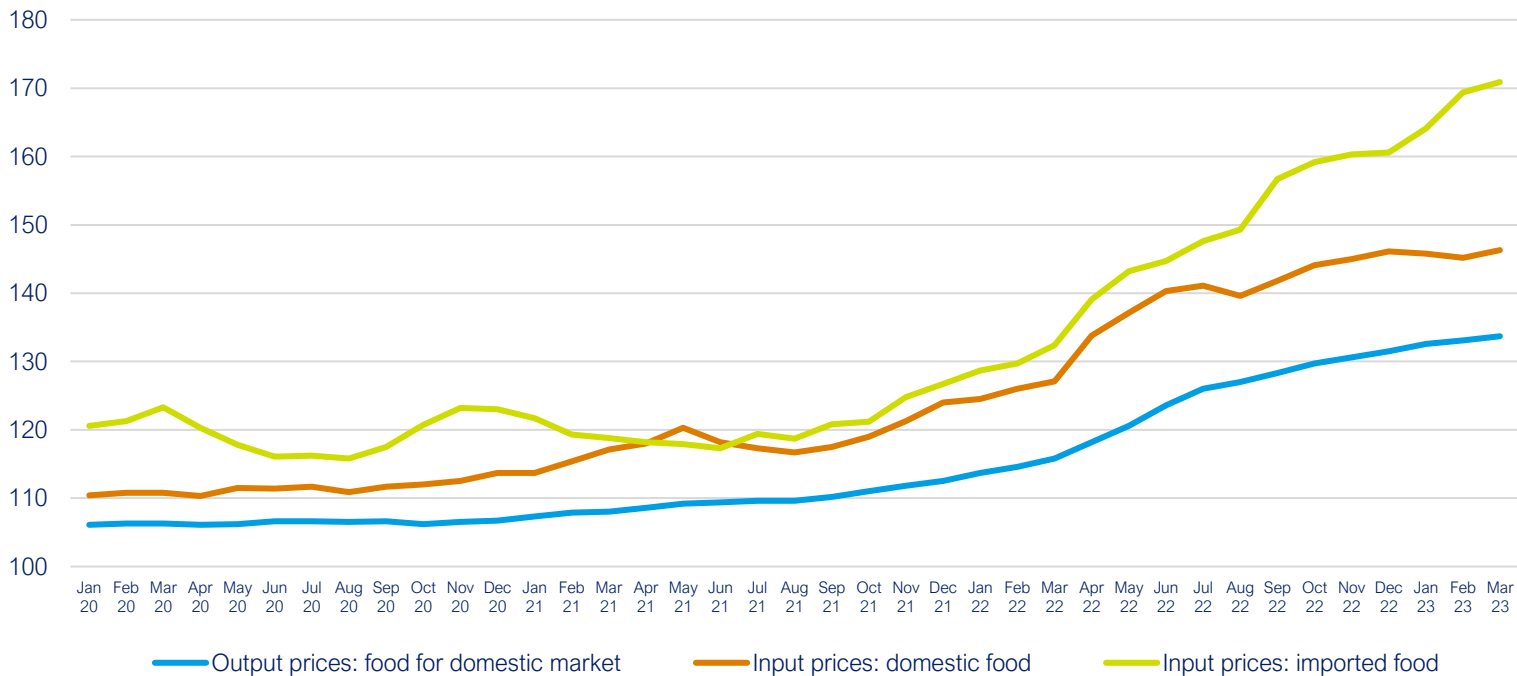
Food and non alcoholic beverages, annual rate of change in price, March 2023

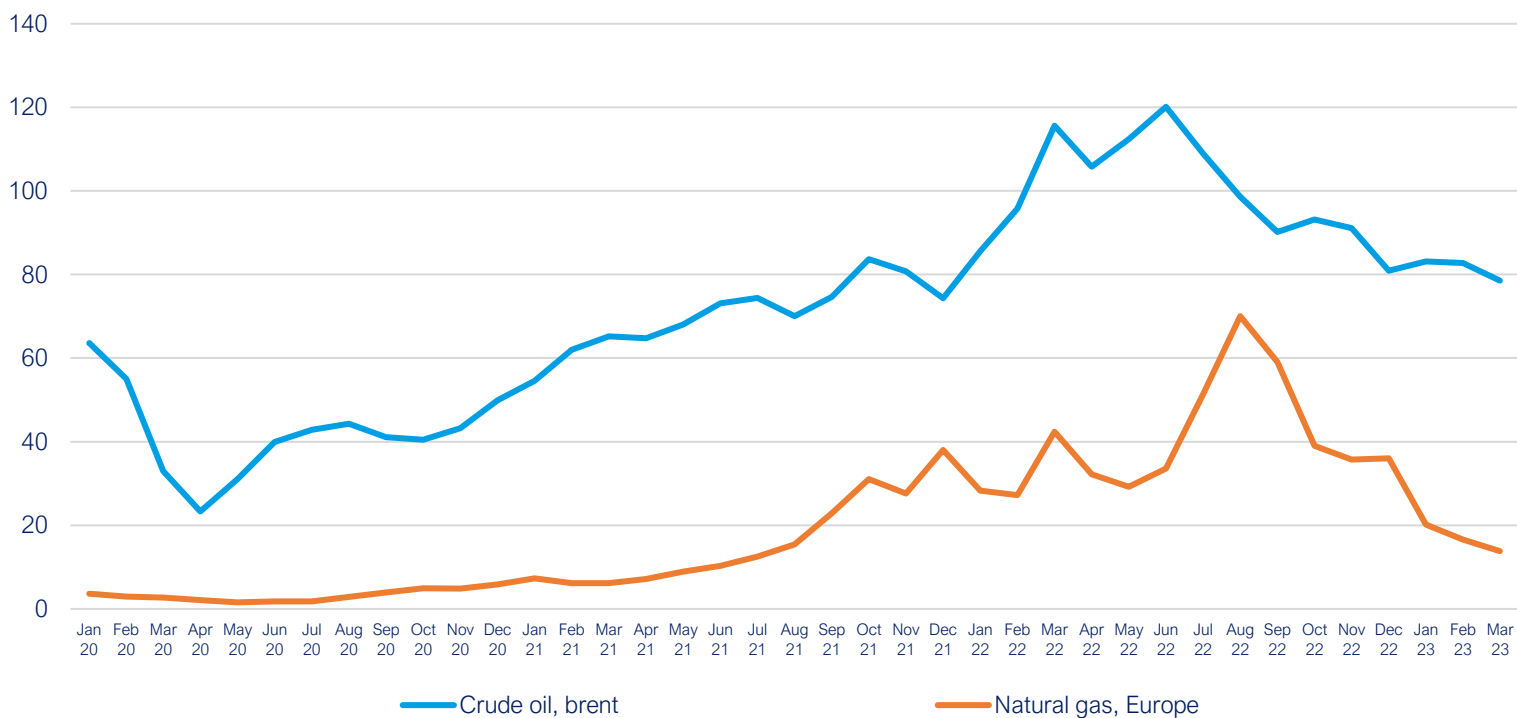
Input prices (domestic food), input prices (imported food), output prices (food for domestic market), 2015 = 100

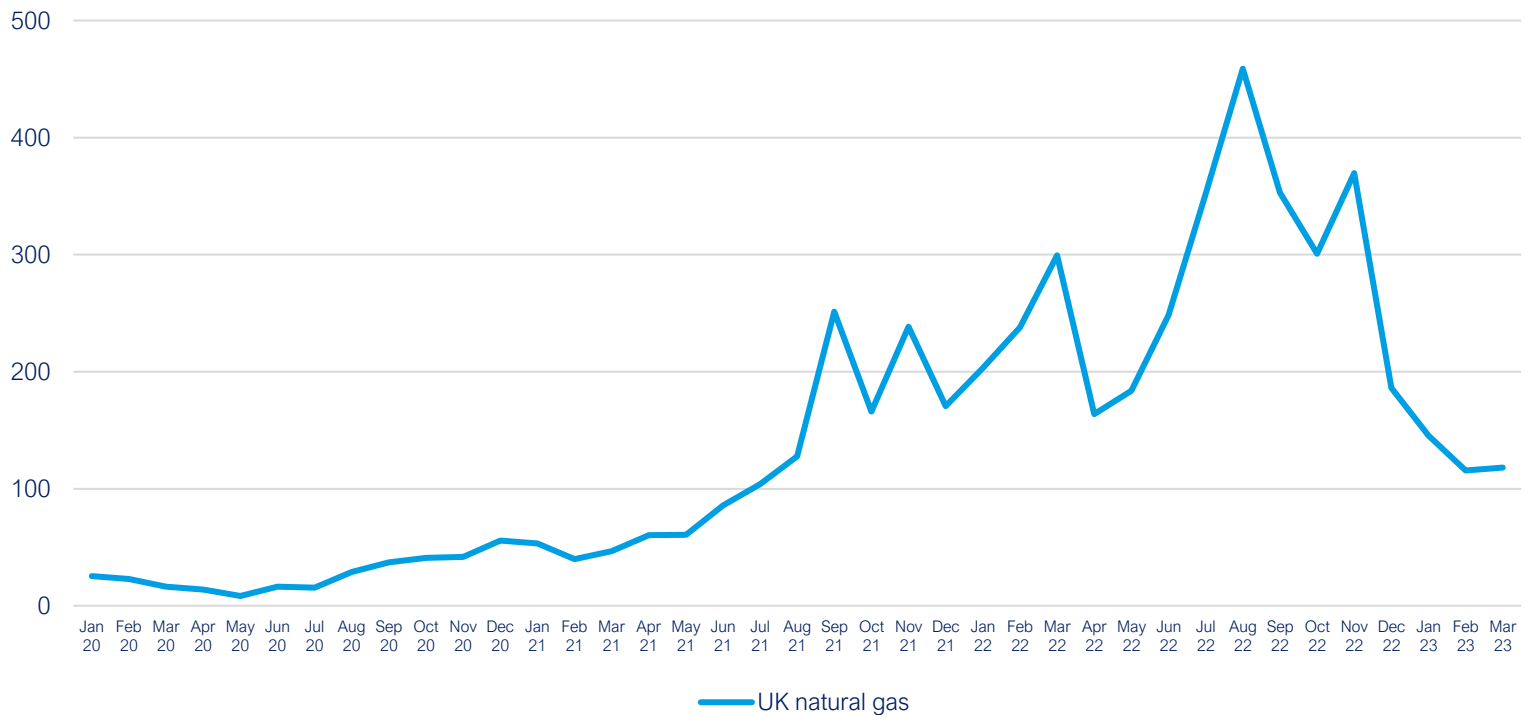

Crude oil (\$/bbl) and natural gas (\$/mmbtu)



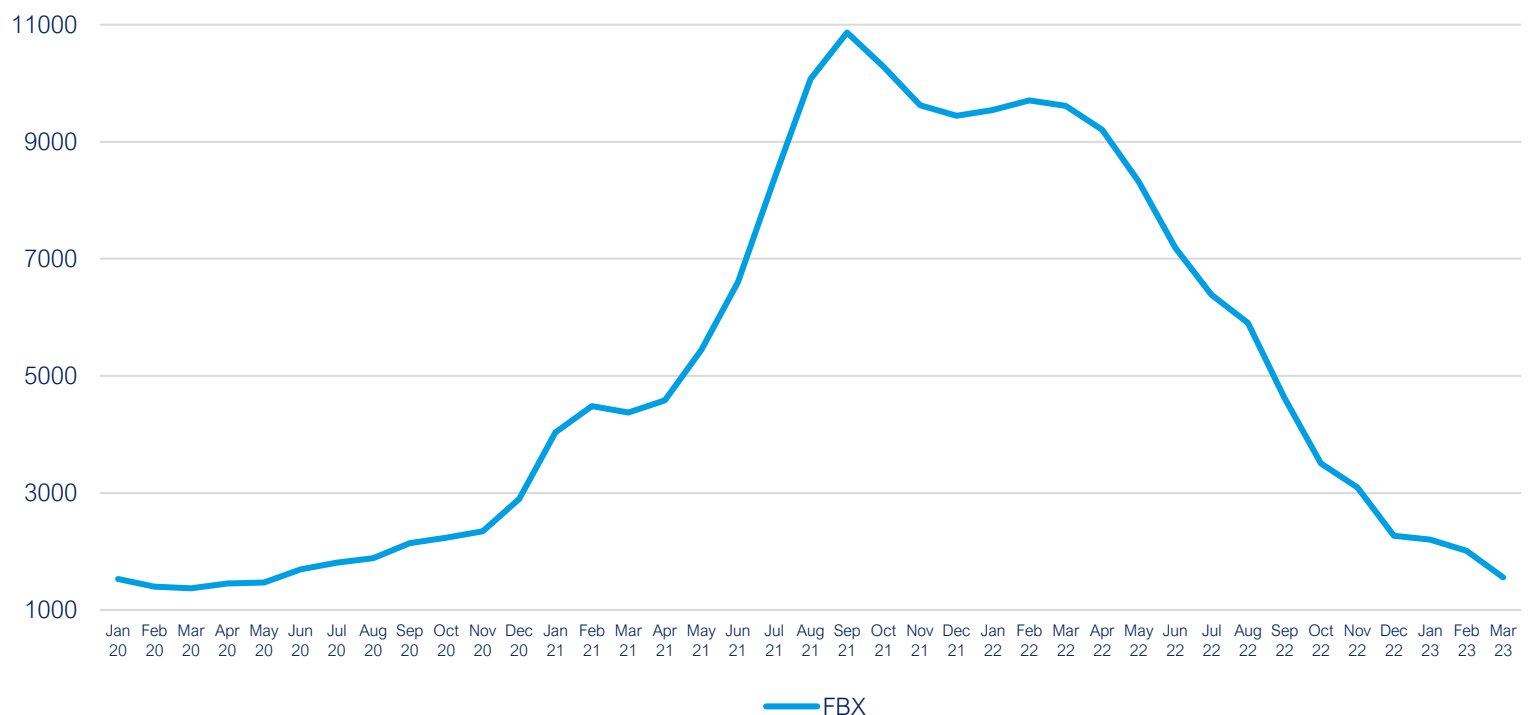

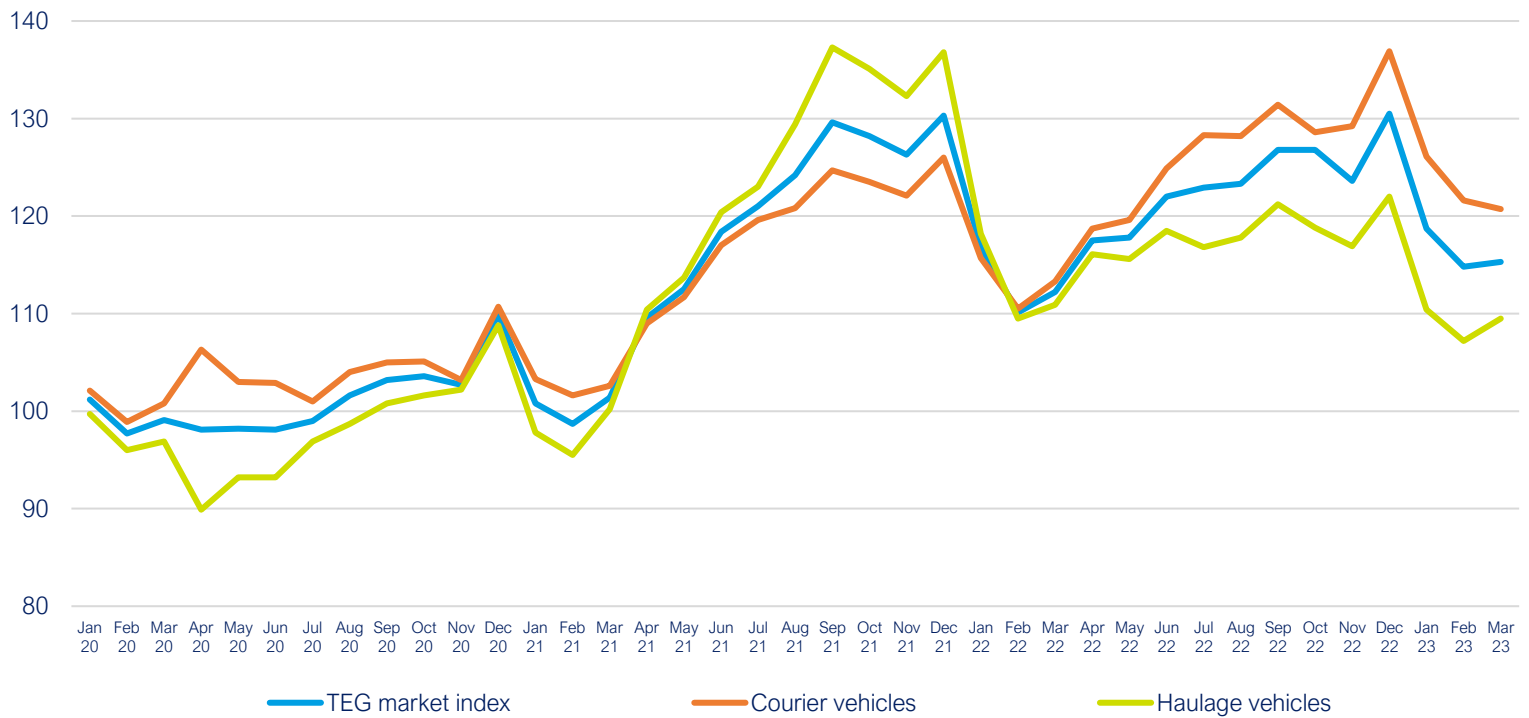
Freightos Baltic Index (FBX): Global Container Freight Index

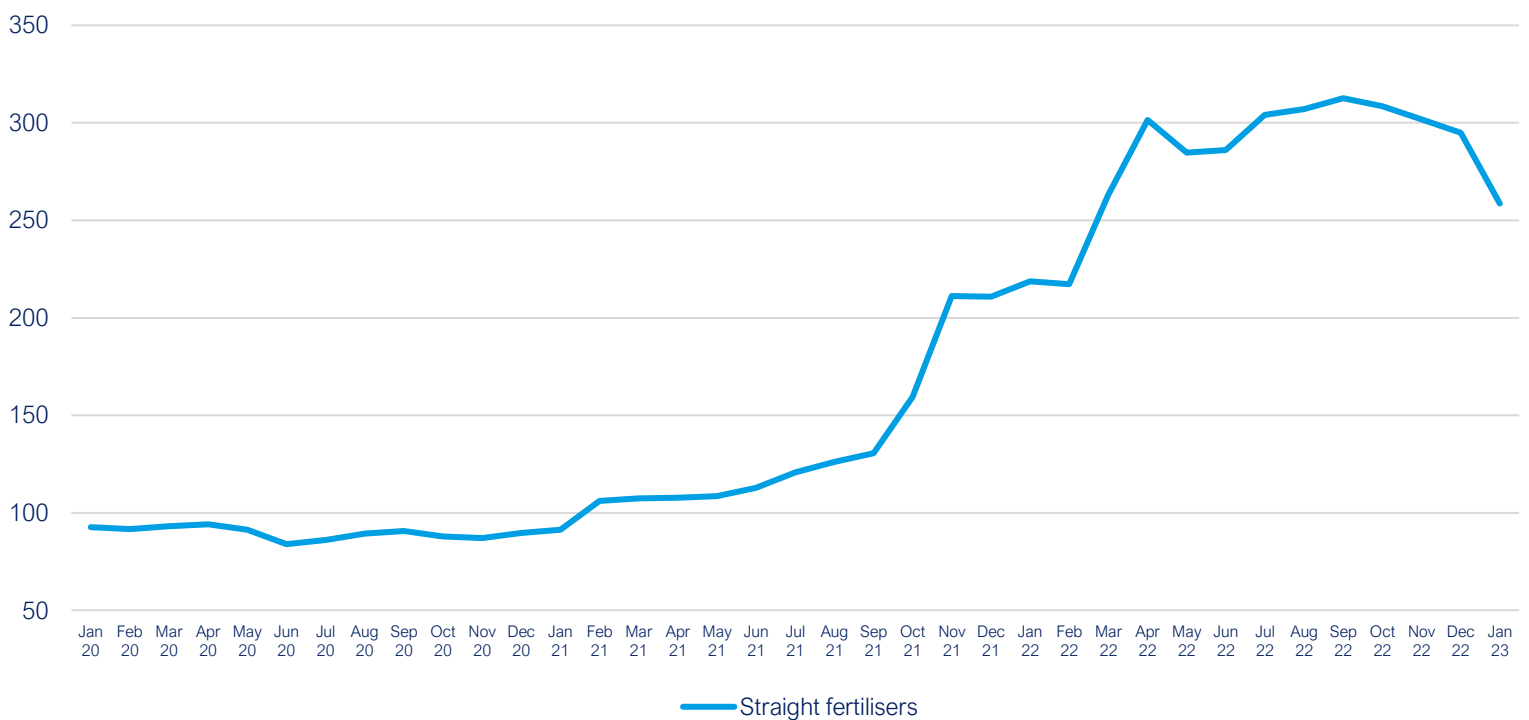

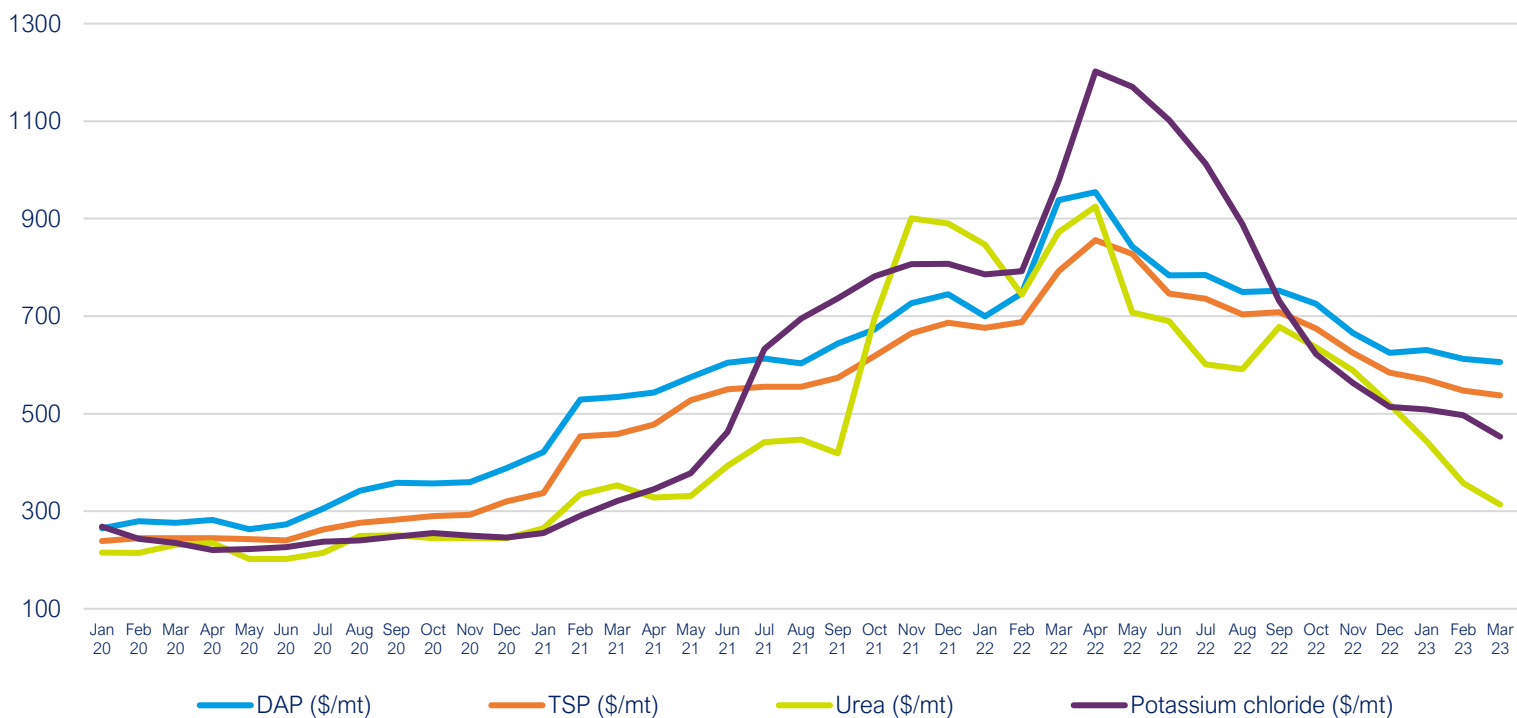
Straight fertilisers, 2015 = 100

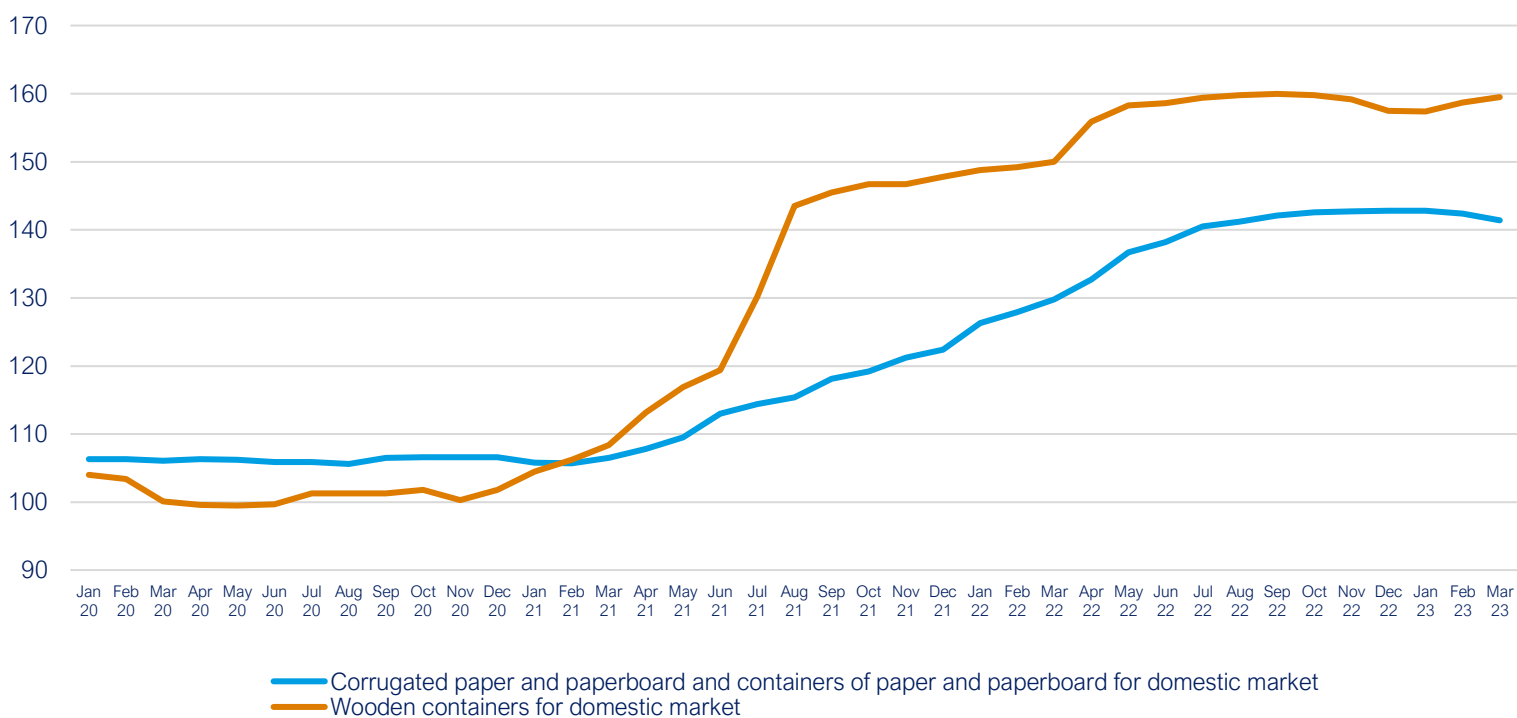

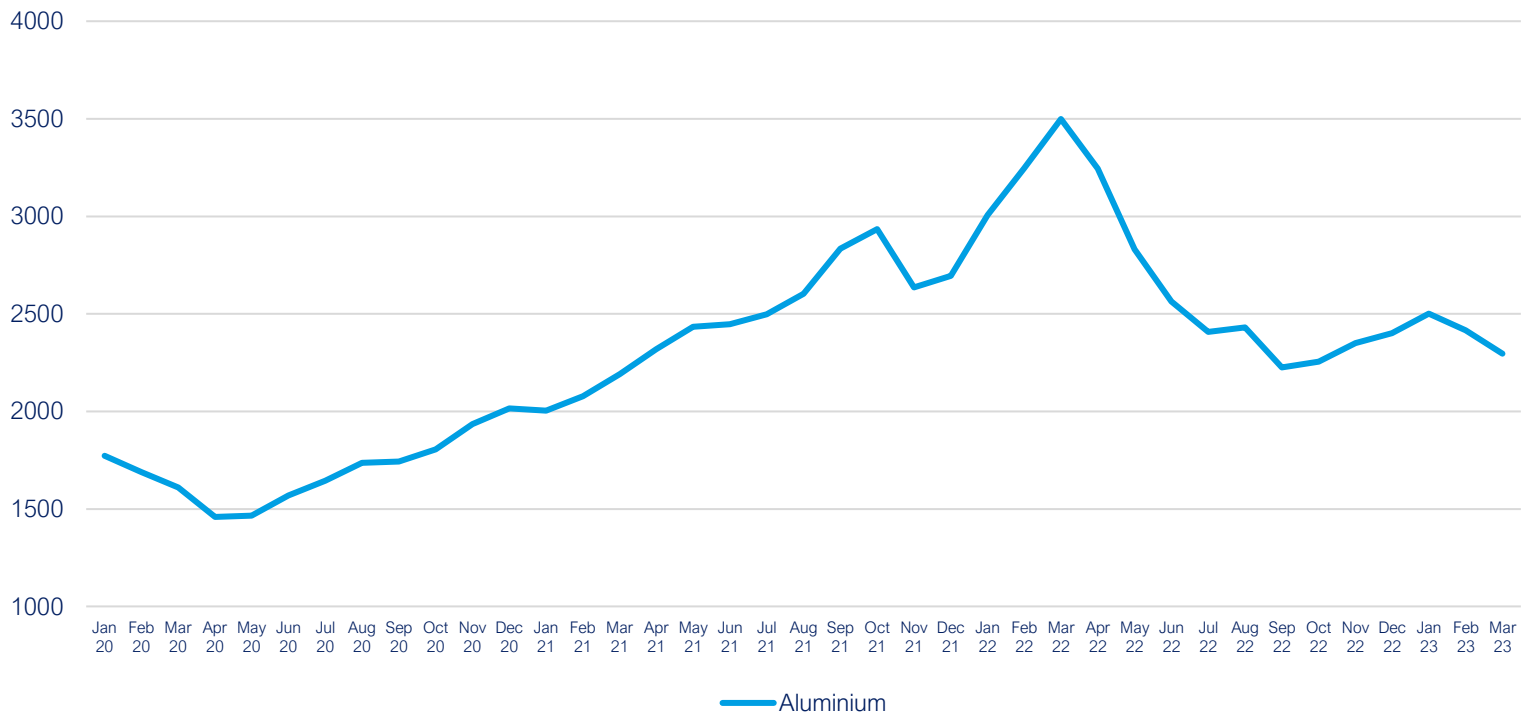

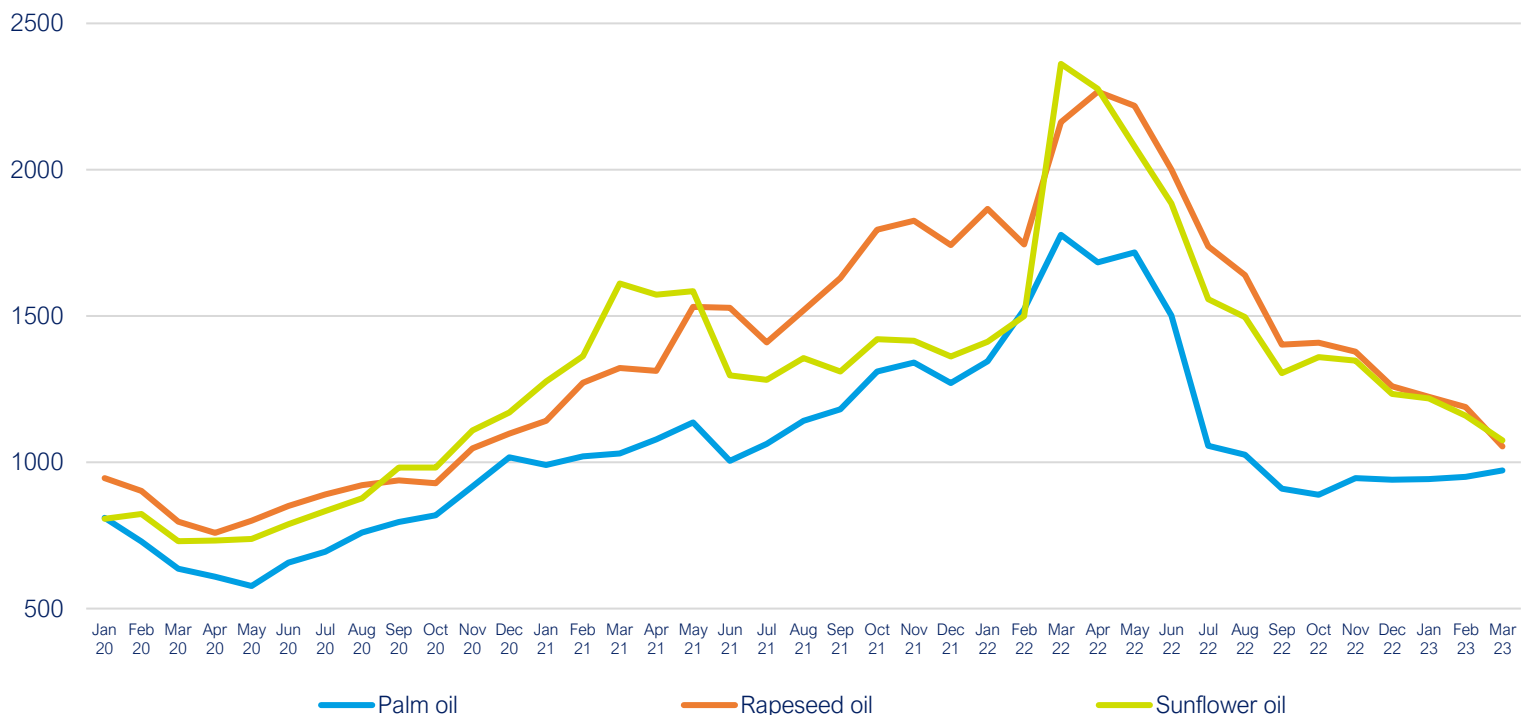
Aluminium (\$/mt)

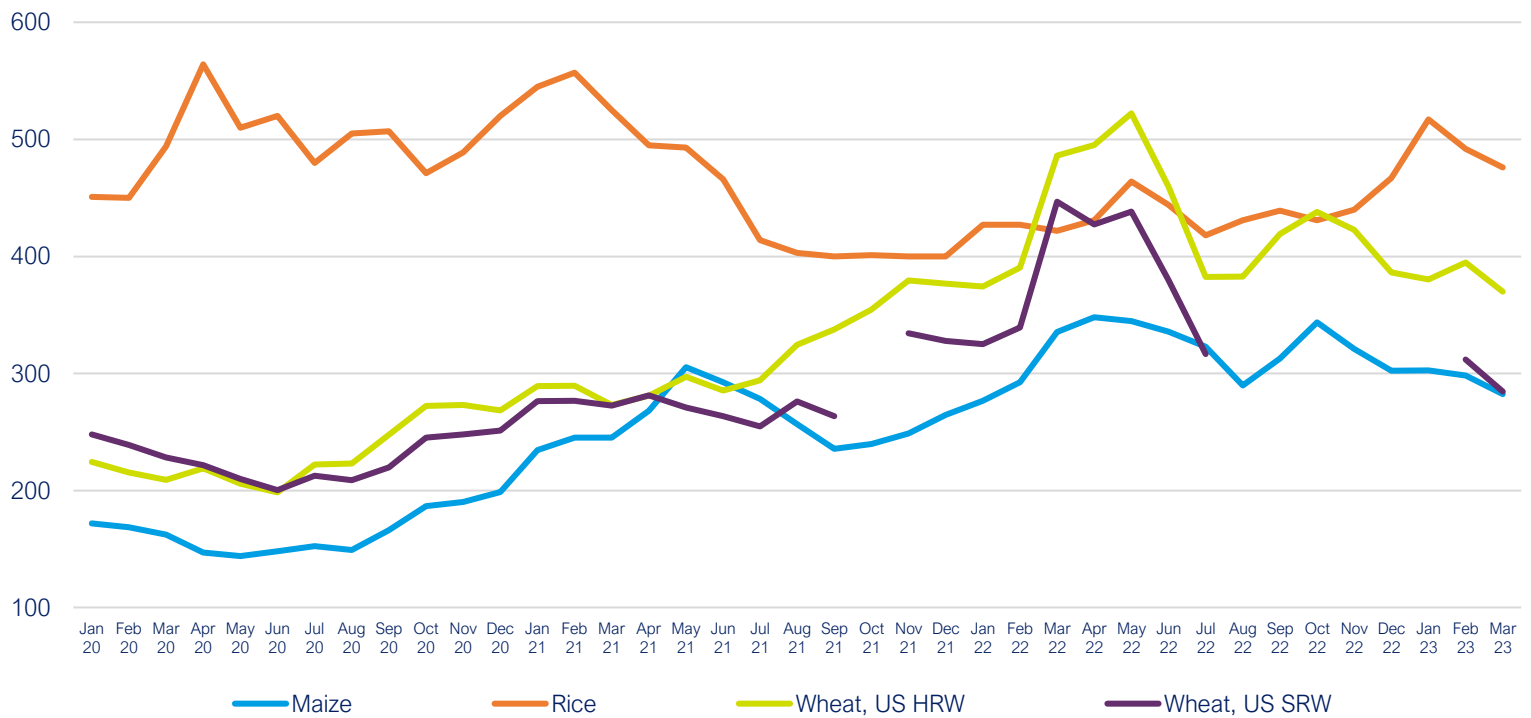
Agricultural raw materials

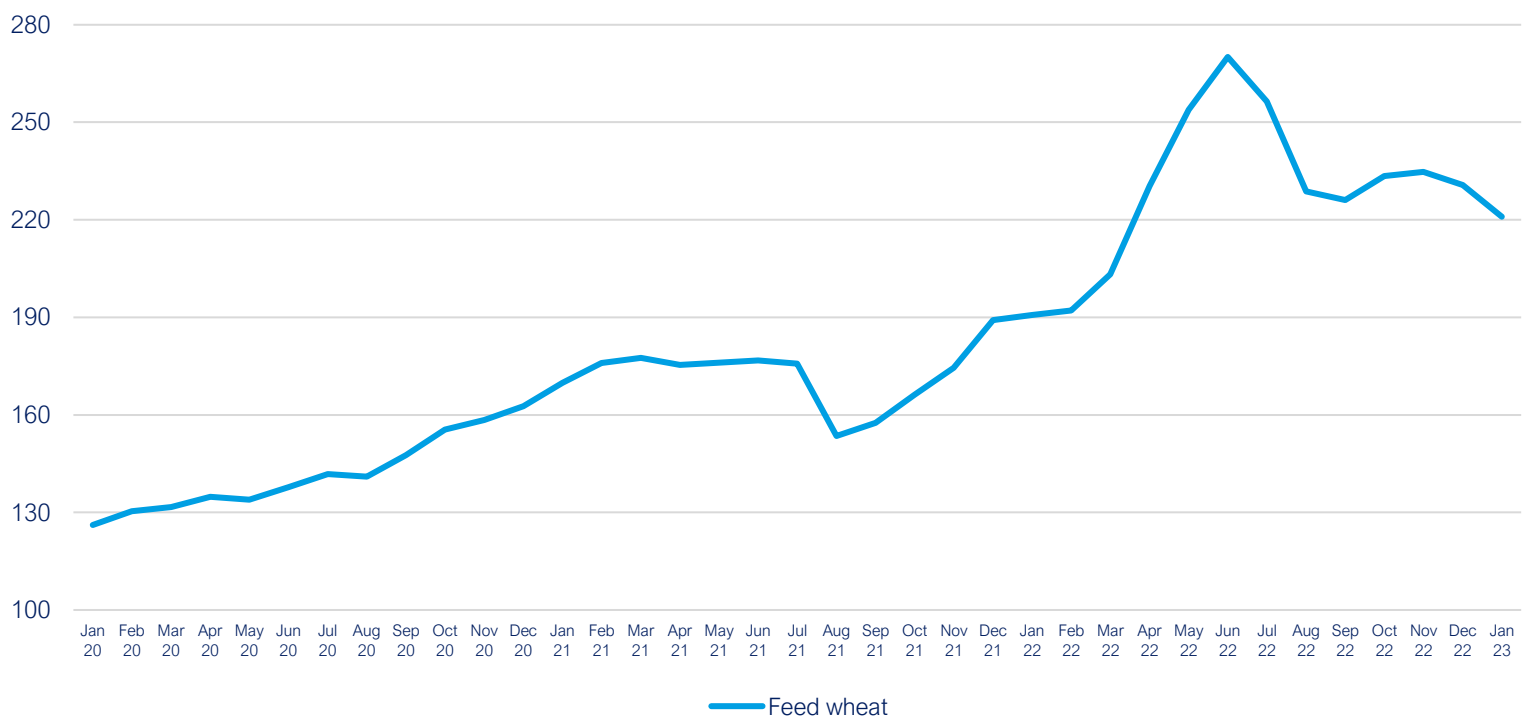
Maize, rice and wheat (\$/mt)

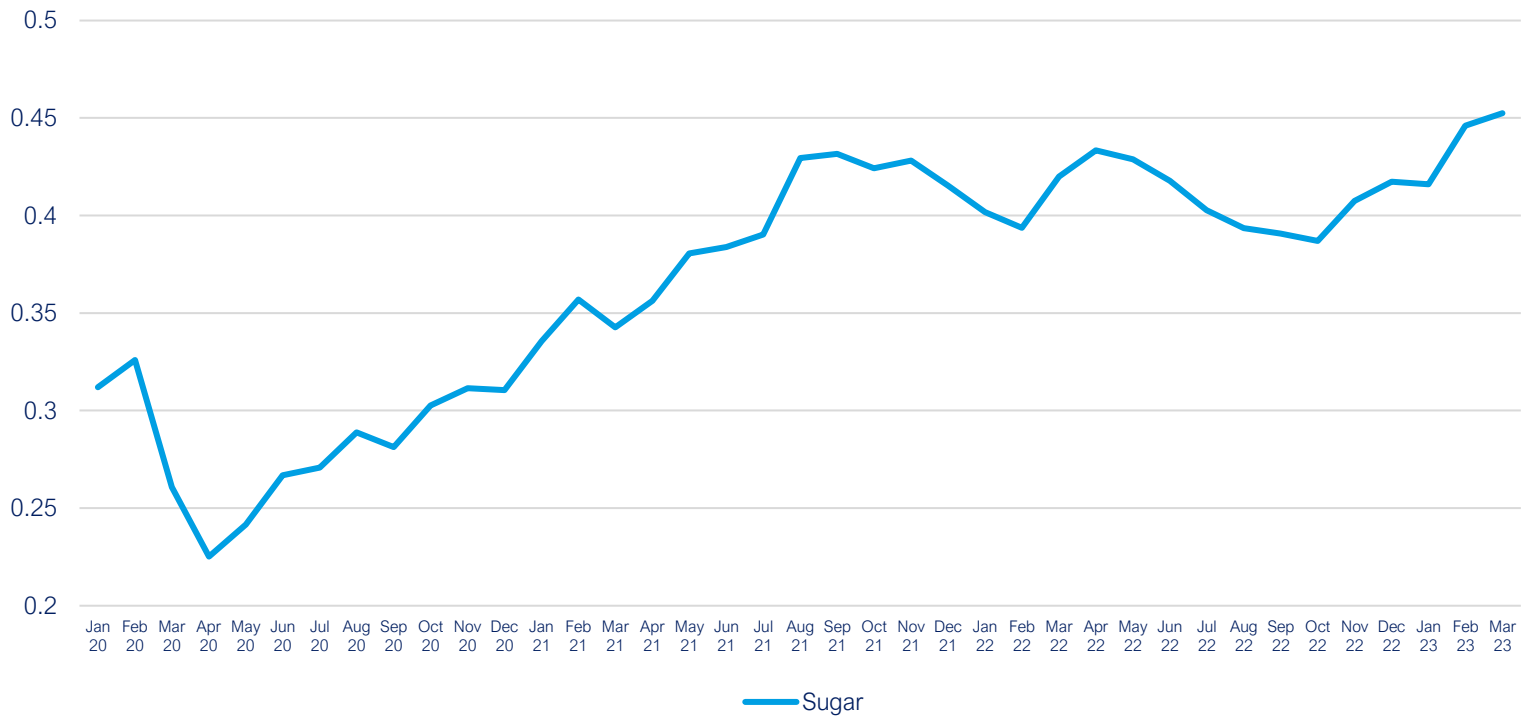
Feed wheat, 2015 = 100

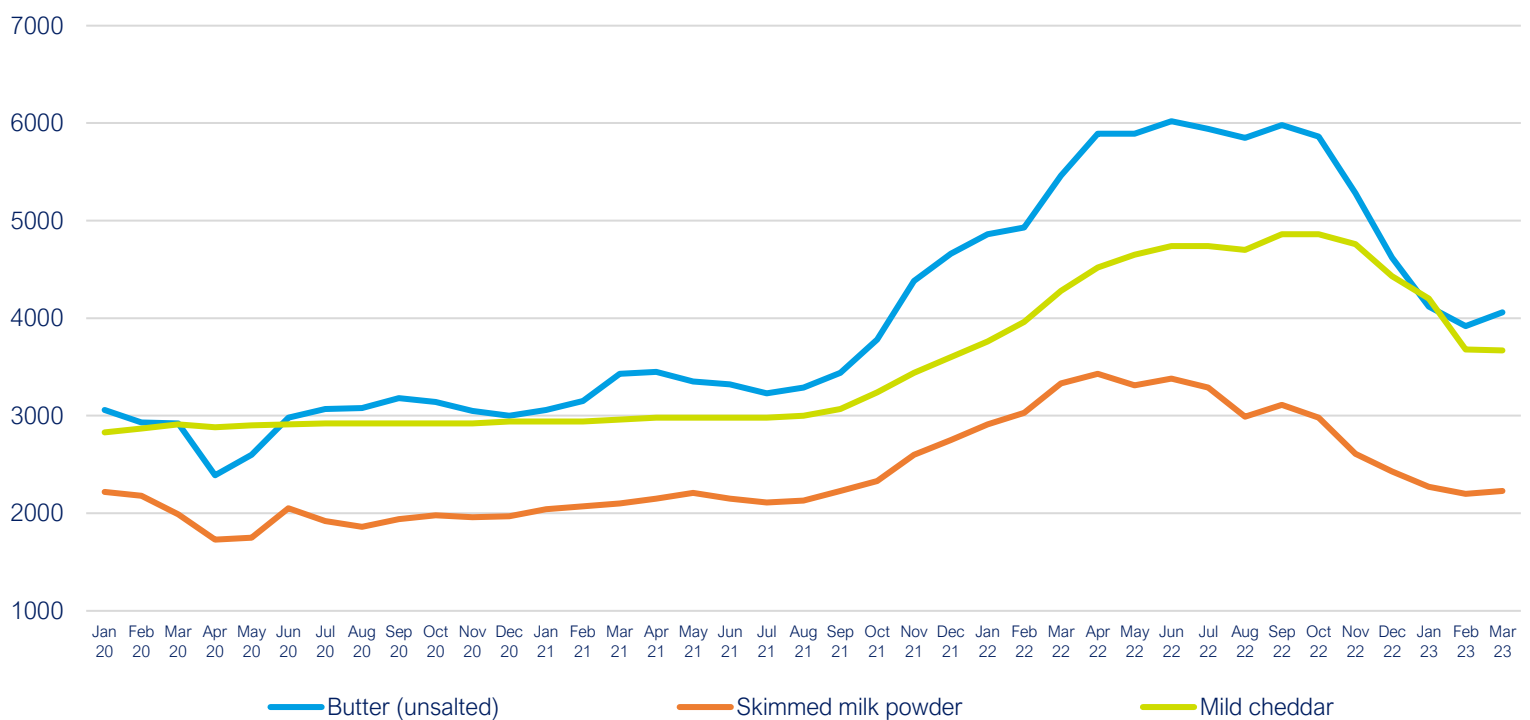

Sugar (\$/kg)



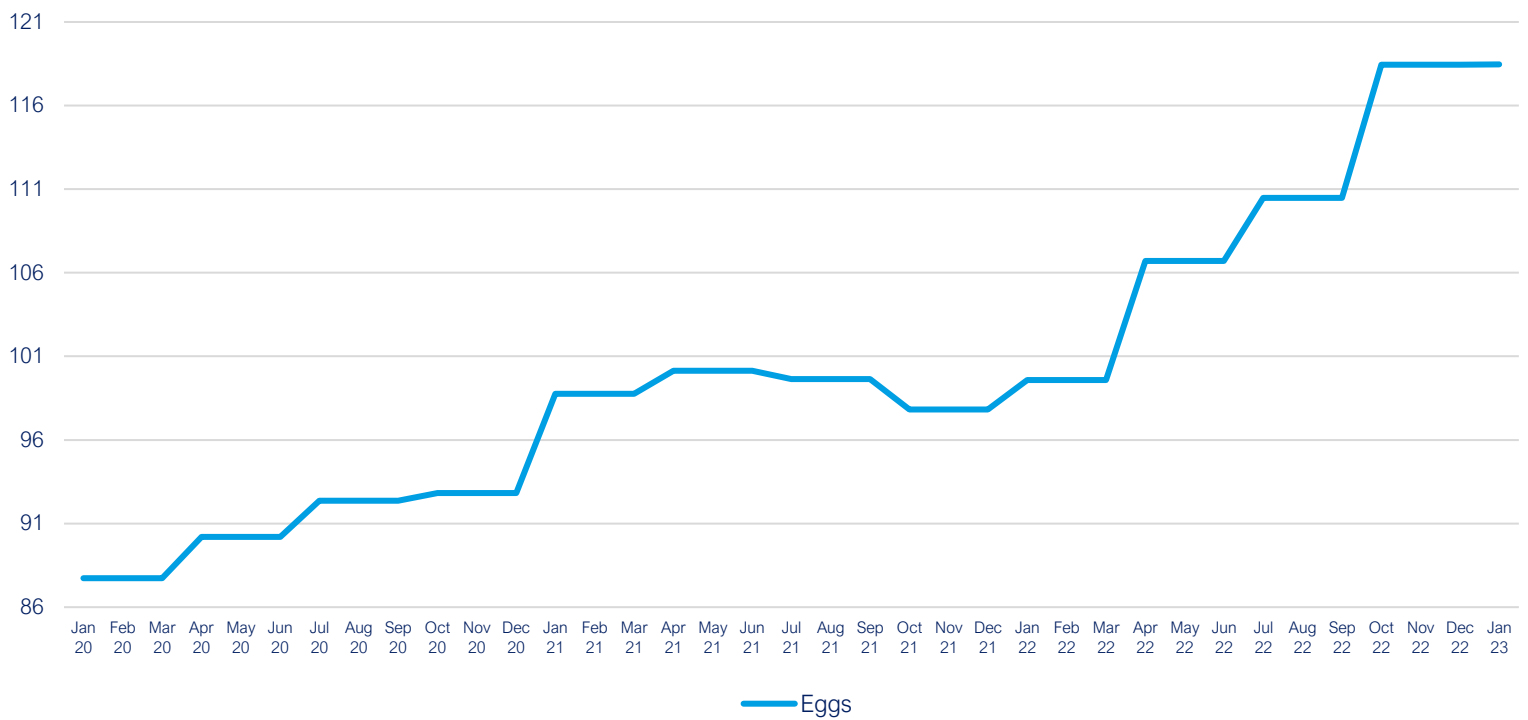

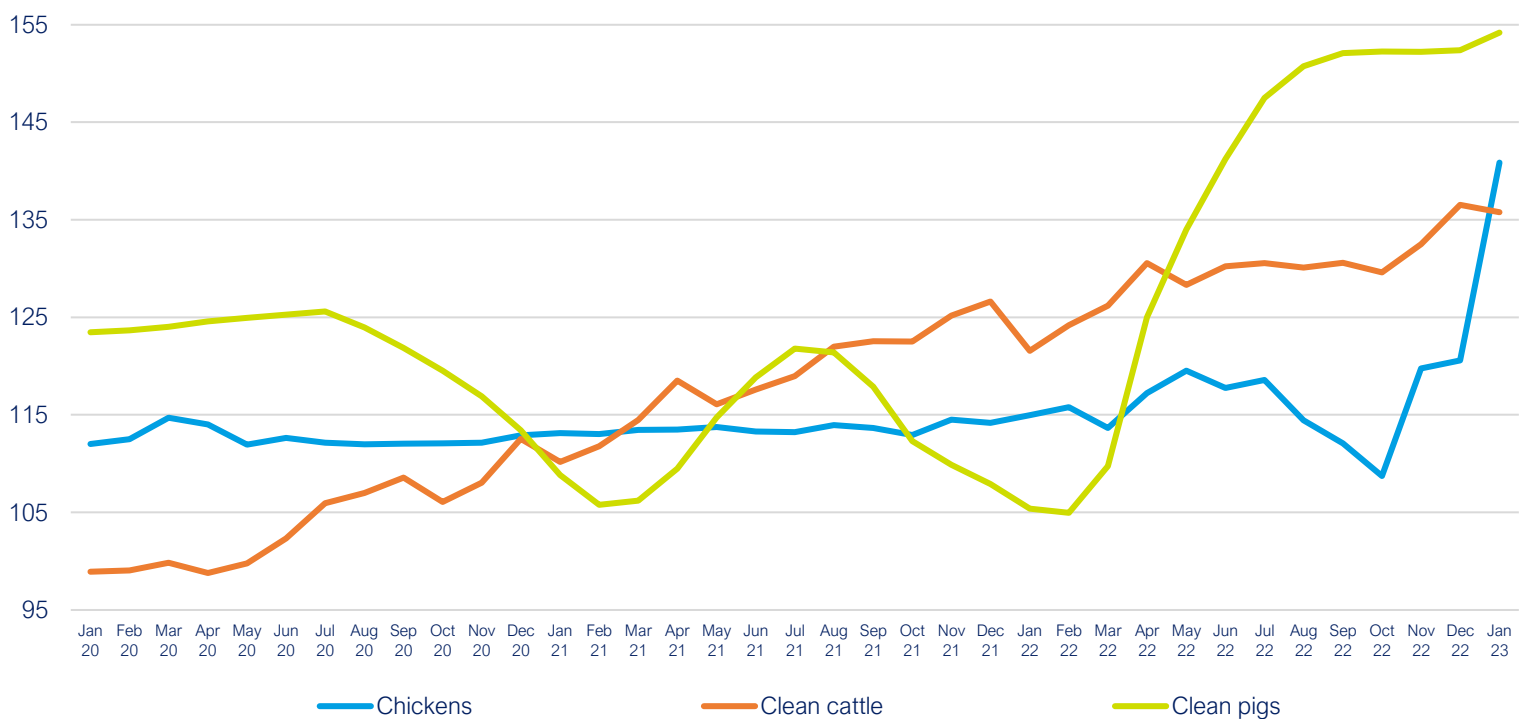
Eggs, 2015 = 100

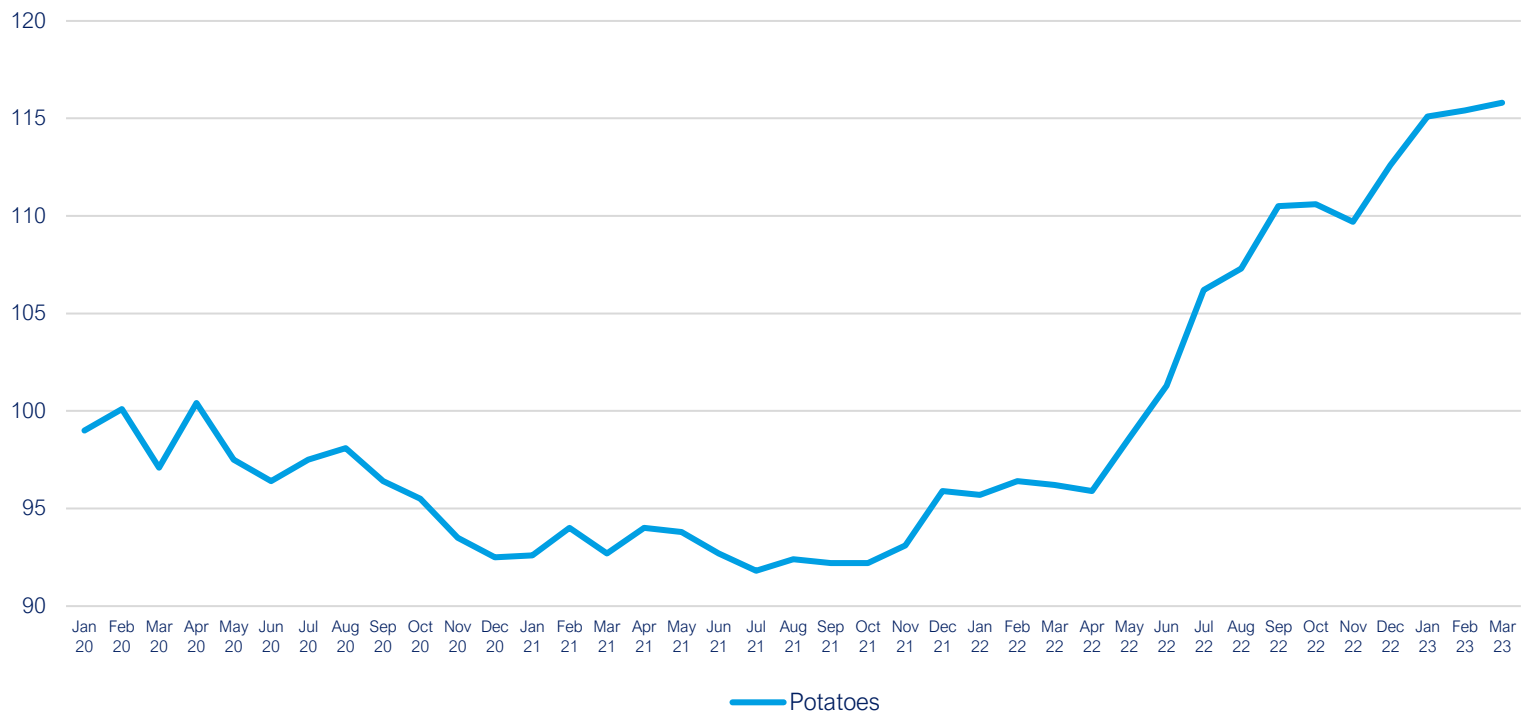
Chicken, beef and pork, 2015 = 100

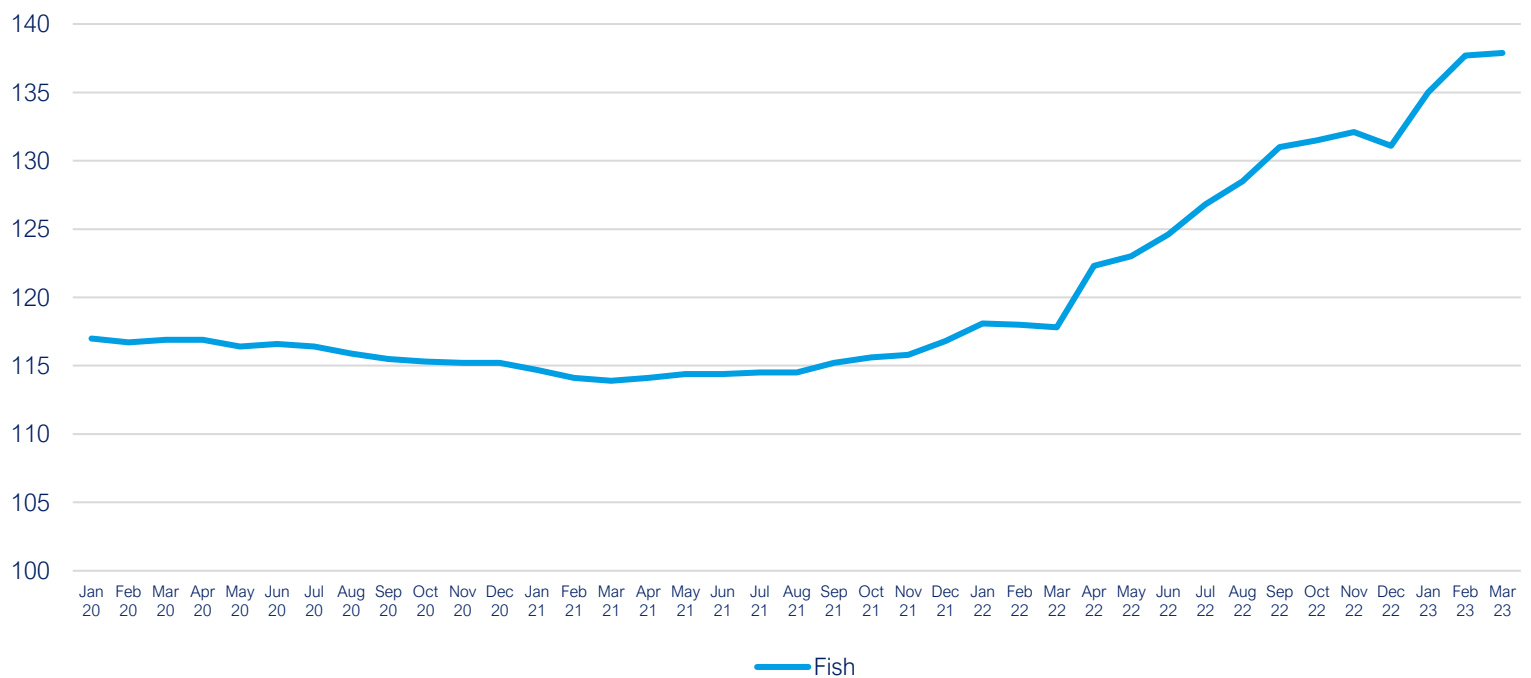
