

What does SSA stand for?

The Seasoning and Spice Association (SSA) is the leading voice of the UK seasoning and spice industry and it promotes the interests of its members in all aspects of the importation, processing and distribution of seasonings, herbs, spices and related products. SSA members represent 95% of labelled herb and spice products in the UK.

What is the drive behind SSA?

The Association acts on behalf of its members as a central medium of communication with the UK Government, political institutions at a European level, any trade, regulatory or enforcement bodies and other public/private bodies where appropriate. In this role, SSA provides advice and information to these bodies and to Association member companies. SSA is an active member of the European Spice Association (ESA) and the European Snacks Association (ESA Snacks) and is formed of the following committees: Executive Board, Technical Committee and Ad hoc working groups.
