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Government Is Debating Whether To Delay Post-Brexit Import Checks Again



Exclusive: The government is strongly considering delaying checks on imports from the European Union again amid warnings of severe disruption to supplies in the run-up to Christmas.


The post-Brexit paperwork for imports is currently due to be phased in from October, with most of it coming in January. It was originally supposed to be introduced in April but ministers decided to <u>delay them</u> by six months in order to give businesses and UK ports more time to prepare.

Boris Johnson was <u>warmed</u> at the time that introducing the checks in April would rock supplies of food just as hospitality businesses were re-opening after lockdown. The UK gets around two-thirds of its fruit, vegetables and cheese and over half of its wine from the continent, among other items.

However, Politics Home understands that government officials are now debating the pros and cons of delaying the introduction of checks on imports for a second time. Some industry figures are even expecting the government to announce a further delay in the next few days.





What is changing in October?



Introduction of pre-notification, certification, and documentary checks on:

- Products of Animal Origin (POAO)
 - Animal By-Products (ABP)

New Sanitary and Phytosanitary Controls from October 2021

- ► IPAFFS Import pre-notification (4hrs) appoint an agent
- Documentary checks carried out remotely. DEFRA will guide and assist rather than punish at this stage.
- Remember Transit notifications i.e. Landbridge movemnts need to be considered via IPAFFS
- Only Identity and physical checks at destination on things like high-risk animals



What your EU shipper must do

1. Ensure GB requirements are met



2. Export Health Certificate produced

3. Vet inspects goods and seals load -Pallet level

How to use IPAFFS (Import of Product, Animals, Food and Feed System) to submit notifications in advance of the goods arrival

Use IPAFFS to notify enforcement authorities about imports of the following products from the EU and European Economic Area (EEA):

- Live animals
- Germinal products
- Products of animal origin (POAO) under safeguard measures
- High-risk animal by-products (ABP)

Submit an import notification

You must submit your notification in IPAFFS:

- One working day before your consignment is due to arrive, if it is coming from a non-EU country
- Recommended 24 hours before your consignment is due to arrive, if it is coming from the EU but 4hrs is ok

Information you need for imports from the EU and EEA

You need to know:

- What you're importing
- The date of import into GB
- Which country it will come from
- The consignment's place of destination
- Crossing details
- Truck reg

Hi,

As you may be are aware Great Britain will be transitioning into the next stage of the border operating model from the 1st October, this phase will mainly effect the imports of Products of Animal Origin (POAO), Animal By-Products (ABP), and High Risk Foods Not of Animal Origin (HRFNAO) being imported from the European Union (EU) into Great Britain (GB). As well as importers there will be a lot of pressure on suppliers to ensure they have the products inspected by an official veterinarian at origin and the correct health documents created, please ensure you get in touch with your local port health authority for guidance to ensure you are prepared and know exactly what documents you will need for your products.

Step by Step Checklist for your suppliers:

- is the product POAO/HRFNAO?
- If yes please contact the local port authority to confirm the correct EHC to be used for the goods and request a vet to come and inspect the shipment.
- Once EHC has been signed and stamped please send a copy to Unsworth (xxx) along with all supporting documents. This must be sent prior to the goods departing, receiving them any later than 24hrs prior to arrival at the UK border could result in customs penalty's.

Please include:

Intended crossing
Date of Crossing
Truck and trailer Reg

- Unsworth will then lodge the IPAFF's notification and have the documents validated by port health. There is nothing for the haulier or supplier todo
- Import customs entry is submitted and linked to the IPAFF's entry for clearance, once cleared the import documents will be sent to Heinz/Forwarder to confirm.

Please note there is no requirement for the driver to stop at a BCP so this should not cause any physical delays.



Export Health Certificates

POAO coming into GB from the EU must be accompanied by an Export Health Certificate The EHC is issued in the EU member state To determine which certificate you require and how to obtain it, exporter to contact relevant authority in EU member state It is responsibility of Exporter in EU to obtain fully certified EHC It is responsibility of Exporter to provide Importer with electronic copy of EHC It is responsibility of the Importer to ensure the original certified EHC travels with the consignment It is the responsibility of Importer to upload a copy of EHC to IPAFFS




TCA Zero Tariff

- Wholly obtained from an EU state OR
- Has been substantially transformed in line with the relevant product-specific rule - there are 3 basic rules used to decide if goods are sufficiently transformed:
 - The ad-valorem, or 'value added' rule
 - The change of tariff classification
 - Manufacture from certain products or through specific processes







Changes compared to January 2021

Overview

There will be no changes to the core import process from October 2021, and for the majority of goods, there will be no change in import procedures overall. However, certain categories of goods subject to Sanitary and Phytosanitary controls will have additional requirements placed on them, as follows:

- Products of Animal Origin (POAO) for human consumption and Animal By-Products (ABP) not for human consumption
- Additional requirements for fishery products and live bivalve molluscs
- · High-risk food and feed not of animal origin (HRFNAO)

Goods Subject to Sanitary and Phytosanitary Controls

These controls will introduce a number of new processes and procedures from October 2021. Some of these controls, but not all, will apply to the import of animal products (including fishery products and live bivalve molluscs), high-risk food and feed not of animal origin. These controls include the requirements for:

- Import pre-notification and certification (such as an health certificate or Phytosanitary Certificate) required in stages for animals, plants and their products, with documentary checks carried out remotely
- Identity and physical checks at destination or other approved premises on certain goods, such as high-risk animals see Section 1.2.3
- dentity and physical checks at BCPs from Januay 2022 see Section 3.2.3
